

INVERTER MICROWAVE OVEN P100N30APV-PW User Manual



PLEASE READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- 1. Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since open-door operation can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to defeat or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- 2. Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- 3. Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is very important that the oven door close properly and that there is no damage to the
 - a) Door (including any bent),
 - b) Hinges and latches (broken or loosened),
 - c) Door seals and sealing surfaces.
- 4. The oven should not be adjusted or repaired by anyone except qualified service personnel.

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IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using electrical appliance basic safety precautions should be followed, including the following: **WARNING!**--To reduce the risk of burns, electric shock, fire, injury to persons or exposure to excessive microwave energy:

- 1. Use this appliance only for its intended use as described in the manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapours in this appliance. This type of oven is specifically designed to heat, cook or dry food. It is not designed for industrial or laboratory use.
- 2. Do not operate the oven when empty.
- 3. Do not operate this appliance if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly, or if it has been damaged or dropped. If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
- 4. **WARNING!**--Only allow children to use the oven without supervision when adequate instructions have been given so that the child is able to use the oven in a safe way and understands the hazards of improper use.
- 5. To reduce the risk of fire in the oven cavity:
 - When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition.
 - Remove wire twist-ties from paper or plastic bags before placing bag in oven.
 - ➤ If smoke is observed, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
 - ➤ Do not use the cavity for storage purposes. Do not leave paper products, cooking utensils, or food in the cavity when not in use.
 - > The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.
- 6. **WARNING!**--Liquids or other foods must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.
- 7. Microwave heating of beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care has to be taken when handle the container.
- 8. Do not fry food in the oven. Hot oil can damage oven parts and utensils and even result in skin burns.
- 9. Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode even after microwave heating has ended.
- 10. Pierce foods with heavy skins such as potatoes, whole squashes, apples and chestnuts before cooking.
- 11. The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars should be stirred or shaken and the temperature should be checked before serving in order to avoid burns.
- 12. Cooking utensils may become hot because of heat transferred from the heated food. Potholders may be needed to handle the utensil.
- 13. Utensils should be checked to ensure that they are suitable for use in microwave oven.
- 14. **WARNING!**--It is hazardous for anyone other than a trained person to carry out any service or repair operation which involves the removal of any cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.
- 15. This product is a Group 2 Class B ISM equipment. The definition of Group 2 which contains all ISM (Industrial, Scientific and Medical) equipment in which radio-frequency energy is intentionally

- generated and/or used in the form of electromagnetic radiation for the treatment of material, and spark erosion equipment. For Class B equipment is equipment suitable for use in domestic establishments and in establishments directly connected to a low voltage power supply network which supplies buildings used for domestic purpose.
- 16. This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- 17. Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- 18. The microwave oven is only used in freestanding.
- 19. **WARNING!**--Do not install oven over a range cook top or other heat-producing appliance. if installed could be damaged and the warranty would be avoid.
- 20. The microwave oven shall not be placed in a cabinet.
- 21. WARNING!--The appliance and its accessible parts become hot during use.
- 22. WARNING!--Accessible parts may become hot during use. Young children should be kept away.
- 23. During use the appliances becomes hot. Care should be taken to avoid touching heating elements inside the oven, for cooking ranged and ovens.
- 24. The temperature of accessible surfaces may be high when the appliance is operating.
- 25. The appliance shall be placed against a wall.
- 26. Appliance is not to be used by children or persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.
- 27. **WARNING!**--If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.
- 28. The appliances are not intended to be operated by means of an external timer or separate remote-control system.
- 29. The microwave oven is for household use only and not for commercial use.
- 30. Never remove the distance holder in the back or on the sides, as it ensures a minimum distance from the wall for air circulation.
- 31. Please secure the turntable before you move the appliance to avoid damages.
- 32. **CAUTION!**--It is dangerous to repair or maintain the appliance by no other than a specialist because under these circumstances the cover have to be removed which assures protection against microwave radiation. This applies to changing the power cord or the lighting as well. Send the appliance in these cases to our service centre.
- 33. The microwave oven is intended for defrosting, cooking and steaming of food only.
- 34. Use gloves if you remove any heated food.
- 35. Caution! Steam will escape, when opening lids or wrapping foil.
- 36. This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are aged from 8 years and above and supervised.
- 37. If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames
- 38. Metallic containers for food and beverages should not be used during microwave cooking.
- 39. For details on cleaning door seals, cavities and adjacent parts, please refer to the "CLEANING AND CARE" section.

INSTALLATION GUIDE

- 1. Make sure that all the packing materials are removed from the inside of the door.
- 2. WARNING! -- Check the oven for any damage, such as misaligned or bent door, damaged door seals and sealing surface, broken or loose door hinges and latches and dents inside the cavity or on the door. If there is any damage, do not operate the oven and contact qualified service personnel.
- 3. This microwave oven must be placed on a flat, stable surface to hold its weight and the heaviest food likely to be cooked in the oven.
- 4. Do not place the oven where heat, moisture, or high humidity are generated, or near combustible materials.
- 5. For correct operation, the oven must have sufficient airflow. Allow minimum 20cm of free space necessary above the top surface of the oven and 5cm at both sides. The microwave oven rear plate must be placed close to the wall. Do not cover or block any openings on the appliance. Do not remove feet.
- 6. Do not operate the oven without glass tray, roller support, and shaft in their proper positions.
- 7. Make sure that the power supply cord is undamaged and does not run under the oven or over any hot or sharp surface.
- 8. The socket must be readily accessible so that it can be easily unplugged in an emergency.
- 9. Do not use the oven outdoors.

GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS

This appliance must be grounded. This oven is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. It must be plugged into a wall receptacle that is properly installed and grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. It is recommended that a separate circuit serving only the oven be provided. Using a high voltage is dangerous and may result in a fire or other accidents, causing oven damage.

WARNING! -- Improper use of the grounding plug can result in a risk of electric shock. Note:

- 1. If you have any questions about the grounding or electrical instructions, consult a qualified electrician or service person.
- 2. Neither the manufacturer nor the dealer can accept any liability for damage to the oven or personal injury resulting from failure to observe the electrical connection procedures.

The wires in this cable main are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Green and Yellow = EARTH Blue = NEUTRAL Brown = LIVE

RADIO INTERFERENCE

Operation of the microwave oven can cause interference to your radio, TV, or similar equipment. When there is interference, it may be reduced or eliminated by taking the following measures:

1. Clean door and sealing surface of the oven.

- 2. Reorient the receiving antenna of radio or television.
- 3. Relocate the microwave oven with respect to the receiver.
- 4. Move the microwave oven away from the receiver.
- 5. Plug the microwave oven into a different outlet so that microwave oven and receiver are on different branch circuits.

BEFORE CALLING FOR SERVICE

Before asking for service, please check each item below:

- Check to ensure the oven is plugged in securely. If not, remove the plug from the outlet, wait 10 seconds, and plug it in again securely.
- Check for a blown circuit fuse or a tripped main circuit breaker. If these seem to be operating properly, test the outlet with another appliance.
- Check to ensure the control panel is programmed correctly and the timer is set.
- Check to ensure the door is securely closed, engaging the door lock system. If the door is not properly closed, the microwave energy will not flow inside.

IF NONE OF THE ABOVE RECTIFIES THE SITUATION, THEN CONTACT A QUALIFIED TECHNICIAN. DO NOT TRY TO ADJUST OR REPAIR THE OVEN YOURSELF.

COOKING TECHNIQUES

- 1. Arrange food carefully. Place thickest areas towards outside of dish.
- 2. Watch cooking time. Cook for the shortest amount of time indicated and add more as needed. Food severely overcooked can smoke or ignite.
- 3. Cover foods while cooking. Covers prevent spattering and help foods to cook evenly.
- 4. Rearrange foods such as meatballs halfway through cooking both from top to bottom and from the centre of the dish to the outside.

COOKING UTENSILS GUIDE

- Microwave cannot penetrate metal. Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens. Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking. This requirement is not applicable if the manufacturer specifies size and shape of metallic containers suitable for microwave cooking.
- 2. Microwave cannot penetrate metal, so metal utensils or dishes with metallic trim should not be used.
- 3. Do not use recycled paper products when microwave cooking, as they may contain small metal fragments which may cause sparks and/or fires.
- 4. Round /oval dishes rather than square/oblong ones are recommended, as food in corners tends to overcook.
- 5. Narrow strips of aluminium foil may be used to prevent overcooking of exposed areas. But be careful don't use too much and keep a distance of 1 inch (2.54cm) between foil and cavity.


IMPORTANT: To avoid damage, never place frozen food directly on the glass plate. Always use microwave-safe cookware when defrosting or cooking. Placing frozen items directly on the glass plate may cause it to crack or shatter.



CONTROL PANEL



DISPLAY SCREEN

Time, power and indicators are displayed.

AUTO COOK MENUS

Instant settings to cook popular foods.

CLOCK

Press to set clock time.

TIME COOK

Press to set microwave cooking program.

KITCHEN TIMER

Press to set timer function.

TIME DEFROST

Press to defrost food based on time.

WEIGHT DEFROST

Press to defrost food based on weight.

POWER LEVEL

Press to select cooking power level.

NUMBER BUTTONS (0-9)

Use to set time or food weight. But use number buttons from 1 to 6 to set express cooking program.

STOP/CANCEL

Press once to temporarily stop cooking, or twice to cancel cooking altogether.

It is also used to set child lock.

● START/+30 SEC

Press to start cooking programs.

Simply press it a number of times to set cooking time and cook immediately at full power level.

OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS

- ➤ When the oven is first plugged in, a "BEEP" will sound and the display screen will show "1:01" (":" flashing).
- During setting, the system will return to standby mode if there is no operation within 30 seconds.
- ➤ During cooking, if STOP/CANCEL button is pressed once or the oven door is opened and closed, the program will be paused. Press START/+30 SEC button to resume. But if STOP/CANCEL button is pressed twice, the program will be cancelled.
- After cooking ends, the display screen will show End and beep will sound every two minutes until user press STOP/CANCEL button or open the door.
- ➤ In the process of operation, press a valid button, and the buzzer rings once, but if an invalid button is pressed, the buzzer rings twice.
- > The electronically controlled system of the microwave oven has the feature of cooling. For any cooking where cooking time is more than 2 minutes, after cooking ends, the oven fan will work about 3 minutes automatically to cool the oven for prolonging the life of the oven.

Setting the clock

This is a 12- or 24- hour clock. You can choose to set the clock time in 12- or 24- hour cycle by pressing CLOCK button in standby mode.

- 1. In standby mode, press CLOCK button once or twice to select 12- or 24- hour clock.
- 2. Use number buttons to set the correct time.
- 3. Press CLOCK or START/+30 SEC button once to confirm.

NOTE: During cooking, you can check the current clock time by pressing CLOCK button.

Setting the timer

- 1. In standby mode or during cooking, press KITCHEN TIMER button once.
- 2. Use number buttons to set desired time. The longest time is 99 minutes and 99 seconds.
- Press START/+30 SEC button to confirm.

NOTE: When the countdown ends, a "BEEP" will sound to remind you. You can check the countdown time by pressing KITCHEN TIMER button, if STOP/CANCEL button is pressed when the display screen is showing the time, the function can be cancelled.

Express cooking

In standby mode, when you press a number button (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6) once, the system starts the cooking program directly with the corresponding time (respectively 1 minute, 2 minutes, 3 minutes, 4 minutes, 5 minutes and 6 minutes). The microwave oven will start to cook at full power level.

+30 sec. function

Use this feature to program the oven to microwave food at 100% power conveniently. In standby mode, press START/+30 SEC button once (Default cooking time is 30 seconds), the oven will start working automatically.

NOTE: During cooking (except auto cook menus, weight defrost, and time defrost), you can add cooking time by pressing START/+30 SEC button. Each press increases cooking time by 30 seconds, up to 99 minutes and 99 seconds.

Microwave cooking

- In standby mode, press TIME COOK button once.
- 2. Use number buttons to set cooking time. The longest time is 99 minutes and 99 seconds.
- 3. Press POWER LEVEL button repeatedly to select power level.
- 4. Press START/+30 SEC button to confirm.

Press POWER LEVEL button to select power level:

Press POWER LEVEL button	Power (Display)
Once	100% (P100)
Twice	80% (P 80)
3 times	60% (P 60)
4 times	40% (P 40)
5 times	20% (P 20)
6 times	0% (P 00)

NOTE: During cooking, you can check the current power level by pressing POWER LEVEL button.

Time defrost

- 1. In standby mode, press TIME DEFROST button once.
- 2. Use number buttons to set defrosting time. The longest time is 99 minutes and 99 seconds.
- 3. Press START/+30 SEC button to confirm.

Weight defrost

The defrosting time and power are adjusted automatically once food weight is programmed. The frozen food weight ranges from 100 g to 1800 g.

- 1. In standby mode, press WEIGHT DEFROST button once.
- Use number buttons to set food weight.
- 3. Press START/+30 SEC button to confirm.

Multi-stage cooking

Your oven can be programmed for up to 3 automatic cooking sequences. Only when time defrost is set in the first sequence, you can set 3 cooking sequences. Microwave cooking can only be set with 2 cooking sequences. Time defrost can only be set in the first sequence.

A. Time defrost with one or two-stage microwave cooking programs:

- 1. Input the time defrost program. Do not press START/+30 SEC button.
- 2. Input the first microwave cooking program. Do not press START/+30 SEC button.
- 3. Input the second microwave cooking program.
- 4. Press START/+30 SEC to confirm.

NOTE: Step 3 is not necessary if you just need one microwave cooking program.

B. Two-stage microwave cooking programs:

Some recipes require different stages of cooking at different temperatures.

- Input the first microwave cooking program. Do not press START/+30 SEC button.
- 2. Input the second microwave cooking program.
- 3. Press START/+30 SEC button to start.

Auto cook

For the following food or cooking mode, it is not necessary to program the cooking power and time. It is sufficient to indicate the type of food that you wish to cook as well as the weight or servings of the food.

- In standby mode, press the corresponding menu button once or repeatedly to set food weight or servings.
- 2. Press START/+30 SEC button to start.

Auto cook menus:

Potato (230±10 g/serving, 1-2 servings)		
Popcorn (100 g)	The result of auto cook depends on factors such as the shape and size of food, your personal preference as to the doneness of certain foods and even how well you happen to place food in the oven. If you find the result at any rate not quite satisfactory, please adjust the cooking time a little bit accordingly.	
Pizza (150 g, 300 g, 450 g)		
Beverage (200 ml/cup, 1-3 cups)		
Frozen Dinner (250 g, 500 g)		
Reheat (200-800 g)	bit accordingly.	

Child lock

The lock prevents unsupervised operation by children.

To set: In standby mode, press and hold STOP/CANCEL button for 3 seconds, a "BEEP" will sound and the display screen will show "Loc" for 5 seconds, the oven will auto enter child lock mode. Press any button, the display screen will show "Loc" for 5 seconds to remind user to cancel the child lock.

To cancel: Press and hold STOP/CANCEL button for 3 seconds, a "BEEP" will sound and the "Loc" will disappear.

Button adhesion protection

In any state, if any button on the control panel is continuously pressed for 60seconds, the program will stop working immediately. The display screenwill show "FAIL" and a "BEEP" will sound every one minute. Any button is invalid at this time. After troubleshooting, press STOP/CANCEL button to return standby mode.

CLEANING AND CARE

- 1. Turn off the oven and unplug the power cord from the wall when cleaning.
- 2. Keep the inside of the oven clean. When food splatters or spilled liquids adhere to oven walls, wipe with a damp cloth. Mild detergents may be used if the oven gets very dirty. Avoid using spray or other harsh cleaners. They may stain, streak or dull the door surface.
- 3. The outside of the oven should be cleaned with a damp cloth. To prevent damage to the operating parts inside the oven, water should not be allowed to seep into the ventilation openings.
- 4. Wipe the door and window on both sides, the door seals and adjacent parts frequently with a damp cloth to remove any spills or spatters. Do not use abrasive cleaner.
- 5. A steam cleaner is not used.
- 6. Do not allow the control panel to become wet. Clean with a soft, damp cloth. When cleaning the control panel, leave oven door open to prevent oven from accidentally turning on.
- 7. If steam accumulates inside or around the outside of the oven door, wipe with a soft cloth. This may occur when the microwave oven is operated under high humidity condition. And it is normal.
- 8. It is occasionally necessary to remove the glass tray for cleaning. Wash the tray in warm sudsy water or in a dishwasher.
- 9. The roller ring and oven floor should be cleaned regularly to avoid excessive noise. Simply wipe the bottom surface of the oven with mild detergent. The roller ring may be washed in mild, soapy water or in a dishwasher. When removing the roller ring, be sure to replace it in the proper position.
- 10. Remove odours from your oven by combining a cup of water with the juice and skin of one lemon in a microwaveable bowl. Microwave for 5 minutes. Wipe thoroughly and dry with a soft cloth.
- 11. If the light bulb burns out, please contact customer service to have it replaced.
- 12. The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits should be removed. Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of surface that could adversely affect the life of the unit and could possibly result in a hazardous situation.
- 13. Please do not dispose of this appliance into the domestic rubbish bin; it should be disposed to the particular disposal centre provided by the municipalities.

Safety Tips for using the microwave



Check the food container is microwave safe. Do not use a non-microwave safe container as it may explode or cause sparks or fire.



Do not cover or block the vents on the microwave. This could cause overheating and damage the microwave.



Make sure packets or sealed containers are opened before heating in the microwave, as they could explode.



Do not cook eggs with shells in the microwave, they may explode.



Use a low power setting when heating dry food or food with low water content. To prevent melting, do not use a container that cannot withstand a high temperature.



Liquids or foods must not be heated in sealed containers. Food expand when heated. Do not over-fill, leave a gap of at least 3.5cm between containers to avoid food spillage.



Clean after use. Build-up of spilt food can damage the microwave due to excessive burning.
