

BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM

1. Slip Knot (Abbreviated 'sl st')

Every piece of crochet chain starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers (leaving a tail) and pull the tail halfway through the loop. Insert the crochet hook into the second loop and gently pull the loop taut onto the crochet hook.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the base for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain.



3. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st')

The slip stitch is the flattest or smallest of all crochet stitches. You can use this stitch by slip-stitching the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.



4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crochet is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crochet hook and draw up the loop through the stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull it through two loops, leaving one loop on the hook.



5. Increase (Abbreviated 'inc')

You can increase stitches by adding a stitch at the beginning of the row. For example, make 2 sc in the same knot.



6. Decrease (Abbreviated 'dec')

You can decrease stitches, which is really just subtracting a stitch, in a row. Make a half sc, at which point there are 2 loops in the hook, then crochet a half sc in the next knot, at which point there are 3 loops in the hook, and finally wind the yarn through 3 loops to finish a dec.



7. Half Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'hdc')

Wrap the yarn around the hook then insert the hook into the next stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull through all loops.



8. Triple Crochet (Abbreviated 'tr')

The triple crochet is also called a treble crochet, creates larger openings between the stitches.



9. Insert Your Hook Into 2nd Back Hoop



10. Magic Ring

A magic ring is an adjustable starting round used for crochet amigurumi patterns, granny squares and other patterns that work in crochet rounds. Form a loop with your yarn. You will need to loop the yarn around your fingers, insert the hook through the loop. Slide the crochet hook under right piece of yarn from right to left, use the hook tip to grab onto a left yarn, pull the yarn through the ring, make a chain stitch. Put your first row of stitches into the ring. For example, make 6 sc. Pull yarn ends, hold the working end of the yarn taut while gently pulling down on the tail end. As you do this, the stitches should close together at the center, completing your magic ring. Finally, slip stitch into the first stitch. To close this round and start the remainder of your pattern, make a slip stitch into the first stitch of your ring, and proceed to the next round.



11. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the chain stitches into a circle. Each round starts with ch and ends with sl st.

12. Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'Dc')

The double crochet is one of the most common crochet stitches and is about twice as tall as a single crochet. Wrap the yarn around the crochet hook. Then insert the crochet hook into the next stitch loop. Wrap the yarn with your crochet hook and pull the loop through the stitch (three loops now on the hook). Wrap the yarn around the hook again and pull it through the first two loops, leaving two loops on the hook. Then, wrap the yarn around the hook again and bring it through the remaining two loops to leave only one loop on the hook. Complete the row.

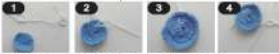


13. Sewing

Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic needle strap yarns are threaded in turn through the knots where the two parts need to be connected.



If details need to be stitched onto the finished product (such as mouth, eyes, etc.) Use the plastic needle and thread to create small stitches to represent facial features etc.



14. Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Fasten off by pulling the yarn through the end stitch and pulling it taut. Cut off.



15. Weaving In/Invisible Close

Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Draw the end through the final loop on the hook and thread it onto a yarn needle. Weave your needle through the front loops only on the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining yarn into your piece.



Please noted that all yarns needs to be hidden behind the stitch.

MAKE A CROCHET PET BANDANA

1. The main body of the pet bandana

(Please use the white yarn.)

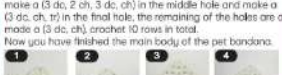
R1: 3 ch, make a (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, ch, tr) in the first of ch.

R2: 4 ch, (flap to the other side), make a (3 dc, ch) in the first hole, make a (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, ch) in the fourth hole and make a (3 dc, ch, tr) in the final hole.

R3: 4 ch, (flap to the other side), make a (3 dc, ch) in the first hole, make a (3 dc, ch) in the second hole, make a (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, ch) in the middle hole, make a (3 dc, ch) in the fourth hole and make a (3 dc, ch, tr) in the final hole.

R4-10: Please follow the rule of the above steps, except for make a (3 dc, 2 ch, 3 dc, ch) in the middle hole and make a (3 dc, ch, tr) in the final hole, the remaining of the holes are all make a (3 dc, ch) crochet 10 rows in total.

Now you have finished the main body of the pet bandana.



2. The straps of the pet bandana

1. (Note: After finished the main body, please do not disconnect the thread.)

Continuously make 70 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 68 sc.

2. Make 3 sc in each hole along the edge of the main body.

3. Now start to make the other side's strap, as the same as the step 1, continuously make 70 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 68 sc.

Now you have finished the straps of the pet bandana.



3. The lace trim of the pet bandana

(Please use the red yarn.)

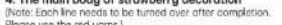
1. Make 1 sc in the first hole.

2. Make 7 dc in the second hole.

3. According to the above rules, repeat 4 x (sc, 7 dc) in subsequent holes in turn.

4. Make 7 dc in the middle hole in the top.

5. Symmetrical on the left side, please repeat 5 x (7 dc, sc) in subsequent holes in turn.



4. The main body of strawberry decoration

(Note: Each line needs to be turned over after completion. Please use the red yarn.)

R1: 3 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 2 inc.



R2: inc, 2 sc, inc	R3: 6 sc
R4: inc, 4 sc, inc	R5: 8 sc
R6: inc, 6 sc, inc	R7: 10 sc
R8: inc, 8 sc, inc	R9-11: 12 sc
R12: dec, 8 sc, dec	
R13: dec, 6 sc, dec	
R14: dec, 4 sc, dec	
R15: Make a sc in each knot of the outermost round.	

5. Strawberry leaves

(Note: Insert the crochet hook from the right side of the top of the main body of the strawberry decoration.)

R1: 3 sc, 4 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 3 sc.

R2: 5 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 2 sl, sc, hdc, and then make a (sl, st) in the half of the second-to-last sc of R1.

R3: 4 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 2 sl, sc, hdc, dc, and then make a (sl, st) in the half of the fourth-to-last sc of R1.

R4: 5 ch, insert your hook into 2nd back hoop to make 2 sl, sc, hdc, and then make a (sl, st) in the half of the first sc of R1.

6. Sewing all the parts

1. Use the plastic needle to sew the strawberry decoration onto the main body of the pet bandana. (Fig. 1) Once finished, hide the excess threads inside the main body.

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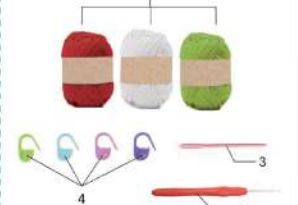
