

BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM

1. Stitch (Abbreviated 'st')

Slip knot

Every piece of crochet chain starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers (leaving a tail) and pull the tail halfway through the loop. Insert the crochet hook into the second loop and gently pull the loop tail onto the crochet hook.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain.



3. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st')

The slip stitch is the flattest or smallest of all crochet stitches. You can use this stitch by slip-stitching the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.



STITCHES USED

ch chain () repeat the step between the brackets
sl slip stitch x repeat steps x times
sc single crochet x repeat steps x times
inc increase crochet F/o fasten off

MAKE A CROCHET GHOST DECORATION

1. Head

R1: (Please use the black yarn) 6 sc in magic ring [6 sts].

R2: 6 inc [12 sts]

R3: (sc, inc) x 6 times [18 sts]

R4: (sc, inc) x 6 times [24 sts]

R5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 times [30 sts]

R6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 times [36 sts]

R7: (3 sc, dec) x 6 times [24 sts]

R8: (sc, dec) x 6 times [18 sts]

R9: (sc, dec) x 6 times [12 sts], *1 with the filler.

R10: 6 dec [6 sts].

Now you have finished a crocheted cat ghost's head. Please follow the above steps to finish the heads of crocheted white ghost and crocheted pumpkin ghost.



2. Cat ghost's eyes x 2

R1: (please use green yarn) 6 sc in magic ring [6 sts].

R2: 6 inc [12 sts]

R3: (sc, inc) x 6 times [18 sts]

R4: (sc, inc) x 6 times [24 sts]

R5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 times [30 sts]

R6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 times [36 sts]

R7: (3 sc, dec) x 6 times [24 sts]

R8: (sc, dec) x 6 times [18 sts]

R9: (sc, dec) x 6 times [12 sts], *1 with the filler.

R10: 6 dec [6 sts].

Now you have finished a crocheted cat ghost's head. Please follow the above steps to finish the heads of crocheted white ghost and crocheted pumpkin ghost.



3. Cat ghost's ears x 2

R1: (please use black yarn) 6 sc in magic ring [6 sts].

R2: 6 inc [12 sts]

R3: (sc, inc) x 6 times [18 sts]

R4: (sc, inc) x 6 times [24 sts]

R5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 times [30 sts]

R6: (4 sc, inc) x 6 times [36 sts]

R7: (3 sc, dec) x 6 times [24 sts]

R8: (sc, dec) x 6 times [18 sts]

R9: (sc, dec) x 6 times [12 sts], *1 with the filler.

R10: 6 dec [6 sts].

Now you have finished a crocheted cat ghost's head. Please follow the above steps to finish the heads of crocheted white ghost and crocheted pumpkin ghost.



4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crochet is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crochet hook and draw up the loop through the stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull it through two loops, leaving one loop on the hook.



5. Increase (Abbreviated 'inc')

You can increase stitches by adding a stitch at the beginning of the row. For example, make 2 sc in the same knot.



6. Decrease (Abbreviated 'dec')

You can decrease stitches, which is really just subtracting a stitch, in a row. Make a half sc, at which point there are 2 loops in the hook, then crocheted a half sc in the next knot, at which point there are 3 loops in the hook, and finally wind the yarn through all 3 loops to finish a dec.



7. Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'dc')

The double crochet is one of the most common crochet stitches and is about twice as tall as a single crochet.

Wrap the yarn around the crochet hook. Then insert the crochet hook into the next stitch loop. Wrap the yarn with your crochet hook and pull the loop through the stitch three loops now on the hook. Wrap the yarn around the hook again and bring it through the remaining two loops to leave only one loop on the hook. Complete the row.



8. Insert Your Hook Into 2nd Back Hoop

Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic strap yarns are threaded in turn through the knots where the two parts need to be connected.



9. Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Faster off by pulling the yarn through the end stitch and pulling it taut. Cut off.



10. Sewing


Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic strap yarns are threaded in turn through the knots where the two parts need to be connected.



11. Weaving In/Invisible Close

Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Draw the end through the final loop on the hook and thread it onto a yarn needle.

Weave your needle through the front loops only on the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining yarn into your piece.



12. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the chain stitches into a circle. Each round starts with ch 1 and ends with sl st.



13. Magic Ring

A magic ring is an adjustable starting round used for crochet amigurumi patterns, grannys squares and other patterns that work in crochet rounds. Form a loop with your yarn. You will need to loop the yarn around your fingers, insert the hook through the loop. Slide the crochet hook under right piece of yarn from right to left, use the hook tip to grab onto a left yarn, pull the right loop through the left loop. Now you have the first row of stitches into the ring. For example, make 6 sc. Pull ends. Hold the working end of the yarn taut while gently pulling down on the tail end. As you do this, the stitches should close together at the center, completing your magic ring.



8. Insert Your Hook Into 2nd Back Hoop
