

Note: Battery and AC/DC adaptor are not included.

A. BATTERY OPERATION

For better performance and longer operating time, we recommend using alkaline-type batteries.

- 1. Open the BATTERY DOOR by first sliding it downwards and then opening it upwards.
- 2. Following the polarity diagram on the back cabinet, insert 2 'AA' (UM-3) batteries and close the BATTERY DOOR.

IMPORTANT: Be sure that the batteries are installed correctlu. Incorrectly installed batteries may damage the unit.

- 3. (a) Do not mix old and new batteries.
- (b) Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- 4. If the unit is not to be used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries. Old or leaking batteries can cause damage to the unit and may void the warranty.
- 5. Do not dispose of batteries in fire: batteries may leak or explode.

B. AC ADAPTOR OPERATION (adaptor is not included)

NOTE: Only use an adaptor which has an output voltage rated at 3V DC 600mA and a center negative plug.



RADIO OPERATION

- 1. Switch the FUNCTION SELECTOR to "RADIO".
- 2. Switch the BAND SELECTOR to "AM" or "FM" for the desired
- 3 Turn the TUNING KNOR to select the desired radio station. 4. Adjust the VOLUME CONTROL to obtain the desired sound level
- 5. To turn the radio off, switch the FUNCTION SELECTOR to

IMPROVING RADIO RECEPTION

- 1. Adjust the position of the Telescopic FM antenna to improve FM
- 2. When tuning in AM reception, be sure to place the unit in $\boldsymbol{\alpha}$ vertical position. For maximum AM sensitivity, keep turning the unit slowly while keeping it vertical until the best reception is obtained.

CASSETTE PLAYER OPERATION

1. Set the FUNCTION SELECTOR to "TAPF" if required.

- 2. Open the CASSETTE DOOR and insert a pre-recorded cassette tape with the exposed tape facing upwards then Push cassette door to close the cassette door.
- 3. Press the PLAY BUTTON and adjust the VOLUME CONTROL to obtain the desired sound level.
- 4. Press the FAST FORWARD or FAST BACKWARD BUTTON when you wish to rapidly advance or rewind the tape.
- 5. Press the STOP BUTTON to stop the tape cassette operation.

STANDBY SETTING

In order to preserve the battery life for as long as possible, set the FUNCTION switch to the TAPE position when the unit is not in use.

PRECAUTIONS FOR USE

- 1. For safety, do not wear headphones while in road traffic.
- 2. Keep the volume set to a comfortable listening level. Excessive loudness can damage your hearing.


AUTOMATIC STOP

To protect your cassette tapes and prevent unnecessary wear to the pinch roller of the cassette mechanism, this unit is equipped with an Automatic Stop Sustem. When the tape reaches the end. the cassette player will automatically stop playback.


CASSETTE TAPE OPERATING TIPS

- 1. High quality tapes are recommended to obtain maximum quality reproduction from recordings.
- 2. Tapes with a playing time of 120 minutes (C-120) are not recommended because they contain thinner and longer tape. which has a greater chance of malfunctioning and jamming, which may damage the cassette mechanism.
- 3. To obtain good sound reproduction, the head should be cleaned after every 10 to 20 hours of use. It is also recommended that the cassette be kept away from direct sunlight or in hot, humid or dustu places.
- 4. If there is slack in the tape, remove the slack prior to inserting the cassette. To remove the slack, insert a pencil into the hub and rotate clockwise as shown below:

- 5. A leader tape is provided at the beginning on each cassette. There is no recording on this area, so it is necessary to let the tape run for about five seconds to clear the head.
- 6. Keep the tape head clean. A dirty head can cause distorted sound or improper tape speed. Depress the PLAY BUTTON and use a small cotton swab with tape head cleaner or alcohol to clean the tape head, capstan, and pinch roller as shown below.



READ THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION BEFORE USING YOUR FARPHONES

Troubleshooting Guide

Playback Failure

- > Ensure the cassette tape is fully rewound to the correct starting position.
- > Clean the tape head using a cotton swab moistened with isopropul alcohol.

Distorted Sound or Abnormal Noise

- Clean the tape head, pinch roller, and capstan shaft thoroughly > Check the cassette tape for signs of mold, dirt, or physical
- damage.
- > Set the volume control to a moderate level to avoid overdriving

Mechanical Malfunctions

- In the event of a tape jam or tangling, stop playback
- > Carefully remove the cassette to avoid damaging the tape or
- Inspect the drive belt for signs of wear, slackness, or misalignment. Replace if necessary.
