How To Make A Crochet Tote Bag

1. Body

Attention: the first treble crochet of each circle is replaced by 3ch.
 R1(yellow) magic ring, 8st (8 sts)
 R2(yellow) 8 tr inc (16 sts), F/O change to orange yarn.
 R3(orange) (3 tr in 1 st, sk) x 8 times (32 sts), change to white yarn.
 R4(white) insert in stich on R3's sk 1 (tr, 4ch) x 8 times (40 sts)
 Bring the R3's loop of yarn to the front.
 R5(orange) Weave on R3 (tr, tr inc, tr, 2ch) x 8 times (48 sts)
 R6(white) Weave on R4 (tr inc, 4ch) x 8 times (48 sts)
 R7(orange) Weave on R5 (tr, tr inc, 2tr, 2ch) x 8 times (56 sts)
 R8(orange) (dc, sk 1, 5 tr in 1 st, sk 1, dc, 2ch) x 8 times (72 sts), F/O
 R9(white) Weave on R6 (tr, tr inc, 5tr) x 8 times (64 sts)
 Weave 5tr under the 4ch on R6.
 R10(white) (3dc, 2tr, tr (tr2tog, 2ch, tr2tog) in 1 st, 2tr, 3dc) x 4 times (76 sts)
 R11(white) (3tr, 8tr, (tr2tog, 2ch, tr2tog) in 1 st, 8tr) x 4 times (92 sts), F/O
 Weave in ends.



2. Strap x 2

Stitch 7ch first, insert back to the anti-pneumatic stitch.
 R1: 5tr, stitch 2ch and turn over the fabric to start a new round.
 R2: 5tr
 R3-R7: 2ch, 5tr
 When you finish each round, stitch 2ch and turn over the fabric to start a new round. F/O and leave a long tail to sew.
 Increase or decrease the number of rows you crochet according to the length you want.



3. Sew

1. Place the yarn under 2 aligned crochet squares, insert in next FLO of both squares, yarn over and pull up 3 loops. Repeat to join all 13 squares.
 Note: Before attaching the straps to the body, edge piece with lace base method in Part 4. Lace's F/O, leaving a long tail to weave in.
 2. After completing the lace edge, sew on straps. Use the plastic needle with yarn, pass through the lace edge and stitch together. Fasten off and weave in the tail.



4. Lace

Insert in the corner, stitch a round tr on the top of the body. The method as follow: insert in the angle of the top (2ch, tr inc, 15tr), (3 tr in 1 st, 15 tr) x 2 times

Basic Crochet Stitch Diagram

1. Magic Ring

Loop yarn around with working yarn on top. Insert crochet hook into loop. Hook working yarn. Pull working yarn through loop. Pull yarn up. You now have 1 loop on the hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop on hook to chain 1.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain. The first step is to create a slip knot on your hook. The second step is to move your hook under your yarn to create a yarn over. The third step is to move the hook back through the loop already on your hook, making sure to catch the working yarn. You have now made your first chain. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make more chains. Hold the stitches you have already made in your left hand close to the hook for stability.



3. Double Crochet Increase (Abbreviated 'dc inc')

Make one double crochet into the stitch where you'd like the increase. Then a second double crochet is worked into the same stitch. To do this, insert the hook into the stitch (or chain space), yarn over and pull a loop through. Yarn over the hook again and pull through the 2 loops already on your hook to complete the second double crochet.



4. Half Treble Crochet (Abbreviated 'htr')

Make a foundation chain to the required length, not forgetting to chain 1 more than the number of stitches you desire. Identify the third chain from the hook. Make a yarn over and then insert your hook into the third chain from the hook. Yarn over, then pull through a loop. Now, there should be 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over, then pull the yarn through all 3 loops on your hook. Now, you should have 1 loop on your hook and have completed the stitch.



5. Treble Crochet (Abbreviated 'tr')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus 2. Find the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over and insert your hook into the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over again, then pull through the 1st loop; there should be 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through 2 of the loops on your hook, leaving 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the 2 remaining loops. You should now have 1 loop on your hook and have completed the stitch.



6. Front Loop Only (Abbreviated 'FLO')

You work the stitch as normal, except that you insert your hook in only the front loop of the V, as shown below.



7. Treble Crochet Increase (Abbreviated 'tr inc')

Make one treble crochet into the place where you'd like the increase. Then a second stitch is worked into the same place. Insert the hook into the stitch (or chain space) and wrap the yarn. Pull a loop through. Wrap the yarn over the hook and pull through the 2 loops already on your hook to complete the second treble crochet.



8. Slip Knot

Crochet projects most commonly start with a slip knot. Create a loop about 15cm into your yarn. Insert your hook into the yarn and pull the end attached to the yarn ball through the loop, then pull it tight. You now have a slip knot on your hook. Now you are ready to start crocheting.



9. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st ss')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus one. Identify the second chain from your hook. Insert your hook into the second chain from the hook and yarn over. Pull your hook back through the chain; there should be 2 loops on your hook. Avoiding the urge to yarn over, continue to pull the yarn through the second loop on the hook - you have completed the stitch and should have 1 loop on your hook. Repeat steps 2-4 to finish the row.



10. Skip (Abbreviated 'sk')

This stitch is left empty; serves to connect the front and back stitches and complete the overall effect.



11. 3 Treble Crochet In 1 Stitch (Abbreviated '3 tr in 1 st')

Yarn over and insert your hook into the stitch. Work the first treble crochet. Yarn over and work the second treble crochet stitch inserting your hook into the same stitch. Yarn over and work the third treble crochet stitch inserting your hook into the same stitch.



12. Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Once you have worked your last stitch, you'll have one loop left on your hook. Cut the yarn leaving a tail approx 15cm long. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull through the loop. Remove the hook and pull the yarn tail to tighten it up. This will create a little knot that will mean your yarn can't unravel.



13. Weave In Ends

On the wrong side of your crochet, weave the needle in and out down the back of a few stitches as shown in the picture. Weave the needle back going in an upwards direction. There are no strict rules about how best to weave in the ends of yarn - the important thing is that they need to be secure and invisible from the front.
