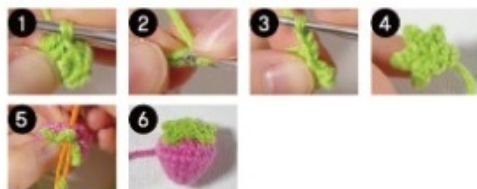

7. Sew

Ears and tail: Sew the ears between R3 and R4 on the bear's body. Sew the tail to the back of the body.

Cake: Sew 1 cake piece to the top and the other to the bottom of the body respectively. Take care not to cover the feet.

Strawberry: Sew the strawberry onto the top of the cake.

Snout and nose: Take 2 strands of black yarn. Sew a triangle in the centre of the snout, then fill the triangle with stitches until it is solid black.

Next, sew the snout onto the body, as shown.



4. Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'dc')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. If you just want to practise, start by making about 20 chains. If you want to make a piece exactly 20 stitches wide, chain 21. Identify the 2nd chain from your hook and then insert your hook here. Yarn over, then draw up a loop; you will now have 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over and then draw the yarn through both loops on the hook so you have 1 loop left on your hook. You have completed the stitch.



5. Double Crochet Two Stitches Together (Abbreviated 'dc2tog')

Insert your hook into the next stitch, as if to make a double crochet. Pull through a loop. Without completing the stitch, insert your hook into the next stitch as if to make another double crochet. Pull through a loop. You should now have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and draw the loop through all 3 loops on your hook. Having worked into 2 stitches but only created 1, you have decreased by 1.



6. Double Crochet Three Stitches Together (Abbreviated 'dc3tog')

To make a double crochet 3 together just repeat steps 1 to 3 above again. Then start making the 3rd double crochet in the next stitch by yarning over. Insert your hook in the next stitch, yarn over and pull the yarn through. Now you have 5 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops. Now you have 4 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through all 4 loops. You have just made a double crochet 3 together.

2. Cake x 2

Make a slip knot and ch 13.
R1: Dc in 2nd ch from hook and dc in next 10 ch, 3 dc in 1 st, 10 dc, dc in 26 sts.
R2-R15: 26 dc [26 sts]
Leave a long tail to sew and F/O. Fold the cake in half and sew R25 with the plastic needle.



3. Bear Ear x 2

Make a slip knot and ch 3.
R1: Dc in 2nd ch from hook and tr in next ch [2 sts]
Ch 1 to secure. Leave a long tail to sew and F/O.



4. Bear Tail

Make a slip knot and ch 6.
R1: Dc in 2nd ch from hook and 4 dc in next ch [5 sts]
Ch 1 to secure. Leave a long tail to sew and F/O.

10. 3 Double Crochet in 1 Stitch (Abbreviated '3 dc in 1 st')

Yarn over and insert your hook into the stitch. Work the 1st double crochet. Yarn over and work the 2nd double crochet stitch inserting your hook into the same stitch. Yarn over and work the 3rd double crochet stitch inserting your hook into the same stitch.



11. Slip Knot

Crochet projects most commonly start with a slip knot. Create a loop about 15cm into your yarn. Insert your hook into the loop and pull the end attached to the yarn ball through the loop, then pull it tight. You now have a slip knot on your hook. Now you're ready to start crocheting.



12. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st or ss')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus an extra 1. Identify the 2nd chain from your hook. Insert your hook into the 2nd chain from the hook and yarn over. Pull your hook back through the chain; there should be 2 loops on your hook. Avoiding the urge to yarn over, continue to pull the yarn through the 2nd loop on the hook - you have completed the stitch and should have 1 loop on your hook. Repeat steps 2-4 to finish the row.



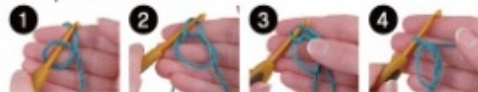

Basic Crochet Stitch Diagram

1. Magic Ring

Loop yarn around with working yarn on top. Insert crochet hook into loop. Hook working yarn. Pull working yarn through loop. Pull yarn up. You now have 1 loop on the hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the loop on hook to chain 1.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain. The first step is to create a slip knot on your hook. The second step is to move your hook under your yarn to create a yarn over. The third step is to move the hook back through the loop already on your hook, making sure to catch the working yarn. You have now made your first chain. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make more chains. Hold the stitches you've already made in your left hand close to the hook for stability.



3. Double Crochet Increase (Abbreviated 'dc inc')

Make 1 double crochet into the stitch where you'd like the increase. Then a 2nd double crochet is worked into the same stitch. To do this, insert the hook into the stitch (or chain space), yarn over and pull a loop through. Yarn over the hook again and pull through the 2 loops already on your hook to complete the 2nd double crochet.

8. Eye x 2

Eyes: Insert the needle in the appropriate stitch using black yarn. Wrap the yarn around the plastic needle 2 times, then pull through the loops. Tidy the loops, then insert into the same stitch to form an eye. Repeat on the other side to create the other eye.



9. Assemble

Assemble the keyring at the back of the strawberry. Use pliers to open the metal ring and attach it at the back of the strawberry. Close the metal ring with pliers. Attach the included charms and accessories.

7. Half Treble Crochet (Abbreviated 'htr')

Make a foundation chain to the required length, not forgetting to chain 1 more than the number of stitches you desire. Identify the 3rd chain from the hook. Make a yarn over and then insert your hook into the 3rd chain from the hook. Yarn over, then pull through a loop. Now, there should be 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over, then pull the yarn through all 3 loops on your hook. Now, you should have 1 loop on your hook and have completed the stitch.



8. Treble Crochet (Abbreviated 'tr')

Make a foundation chain to the required length. For a precise number of stitches, chain that many plus 2. Find the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over and insert your hook into the 4th chain from the hook. Yarn over again, then pull through the 1st loop; there should be 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through 2 of the loops on your hook, leaving 2 loops on your hook. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the 2 remaining loops. You should now have 1 loop on your hook and have completed the stitch.



9. Front Loop Only (Abbreviated 'FLO')

You work the stitch as normal, except that you insert your hook in only the front loop of the V, as shown below.

5. Bear Snout

R1: 8 dc in magic ring (8 sts)
Leave a long tail to sew and F/O.



6.1. Strawberry Body

R1: 6 dc in magic ring (6 sts)
R2: (dc, dc inc) x 3 times (9 sts)
R3: (dc, dc inc, dc) x 3 times (12 sts)
R4: (3 dc, dc inc) x 3 times (15 sts)
R5: (2 dc, dc inc, 2 dc) x 3 times (18 sts)
R6: (5 dc, dc inc) x 3 times (21 sts)
R7: (dc, dc2tog) x 7 times (14 sts)
R8: 7 dc2tog (7 sts)
Leave a long tail to sew and F/O. Stuff fibre filling halfway.
After finishing R8, sew the hole. About sewing the hole: insert in each FLO of R6, then tighten it.



6.2. Strawberry Leaf

R1: 5 dc in magic ring (5 sts)
R2: (ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and dc in next ch, sl st in next st on R1) x 5 times
Leave a long tail to sew and F/O. Sew the leaf to the top of the strawberry body and your strawberry is complete.

13. Fasten Off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Once you've worked your last stitch, you will have 1 loop left on your hook. Cut the yarn leaving a tail approx 15cm long. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull through the loop. Remove the hook and pull the yarn tail to tighten it up. This will create a little knot that will mean your yarn can't unravel.



14. Weave In Ends

On the wrong side of your crochet, weave the needle in and out down the back of a few stitches as shown in the picture. Weave the needle back going in an upwards direction. There are no strict rules about how best to weave in the ends of yarn – the important thing is that they need to be secure and invisible from the front.

How To Make A Bear Bag Charm

1. Bear Body

Make a slip knot and ch 10.

R1: Dc inc in 2nd ch from hook and dc in next 7 ch, 4 dc in 1 st, 7 dc, dc inc [22 sts]

R2: Dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 7 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 2 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 7 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, dc [30 sts]

R3: 2 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 9 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 4 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 9 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 2 dc [38 sts]

R4: 3 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 11 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 6 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 11 dc, 3 dc in 1 st, 3 dc [46 sts]

R5-R9: 46 dc [46 sts]

R10: 4 dc, 4-tr popcorn, 13 dc, 4-tr popcorn, 8 dc, 4-tr popcorn, 13 dc, 4-tr popcorn, 4 dc [46 sts]

R11: 3 dc, dc3tog, 11 dc, dc3tog, 6 dc, dc3tog, 11 dc, dc3tog, 3 dc [38 sts]

R12: 2 dc, dc3tog, 9 dc, dc3tog, 4 dc, dc3tog, 9 dc, dc3tog, 2 dc [30 sts]

R13: (3 dc, dc2tog) x 6 times [24 sts]

R14: (dc, dc2tog, dc) x 6 times [18 sts]

R15: (dc, dc2tog) x 6 times [12 sts]

R16: 6 dc2tog [6 sts]

Leave a long tail to sew and F/O. Stuff fibre filling halfway.

After finishing R16, sew the hole. About sewing the hole: insert in each FLO of R16, then tighten it.
