

Setup

Power

DC power input: requires an AC/DC adapter (included)

The **POWER INDICATOR** will turn red whenever the portable DVD player is powered on.



Battery Power

DC battery power: built-in rechargeable battery

The **CHARGE INDICATOR** will turn red whenever the built-in rechargeable battery is charging.

The **POWER INDICATOR** will turn red whenever the portable DVD player is powered on.

When the battery is fullly charged, the **CHARGE INDICATOR** will turn areen.

Charging the Built-in Battery

- Plug the included AC/DC power adapter into the **DC POWER INPUT** on the portable DVD player and an AC power outlet.
- 2. Adjust the **POWER** switch to the off position.

The **CHARGE INDICATOR** will turn red whenever the built-in rechargeable battery is charging.


When the battery is fullly charged, the **CHARGE INDICATOR** will turn green.

Remote

Loading batteries to the remote control

- Remove the battery compartment cover.
- Load two AAA (UM-4 or R03) batteries into the battery compartment. (included)
- Make sure that the batteries have been inserted in the correct polarities matching to the symbols
 +, - marked in the battery compartment. Close the battery compartment cover.
- When replacing batteries, replace both batteries.
 Do not mix new and used batteries operating together, otherwise, the operation lifetime will be much shorter than normal.
- Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a prolonged period of time.


The remote control transmits a directional infrared beam.Be sure to aim the remote control directly at the infrared sensor of the unit during operation.




If the sensor has been covered or there is a large object between the remote control and the sensor, the sensor will not respond.



- (1) VOL+/VOL-: Press to adjust the volume.
- 2 DVD/USB/SD: Press to display the menu to select DVD/AV/Media(USB/SD) mode.
- (3) TFT ON/OFF: Press to switch on/off screen
- 4 MENU: Press to view TITLE menu on a loaded disc.
- 5 SETUP: Press to enter into the SETUP menu, press again to exit.
- (6) : Press to stop a playback.
- ? Press to start or pause a playback.
- (8) I◄◄ /▲: Press to skip to previous chapters or tracks, or select upper items in a menu.

REMOTE CONTROL

- Load a disc into the DVD player, label side facing up.
- Manually close the **DISC DOOR**.
 After a disc is loaded, it will begin playing automatically.

Programming a Loaded Disc



OSD Language

You can select your own preferred language.

Captions

Closed captions are data that are hidden in the video signal of some discs. Before you select this function, please ensure that the disc contains closed captions information and your TV set also has this function.

Screen Saver

This function is used to turn the screen saver On or Off.

Last Memory

This function is used to set Resume Playback function On/Off. When it is set on, the same disc can be played starting from where the previous playback was stopped.

Logo Type

This function is used to change the Power-on display mode. Select Default or Jacket, the unit shall display the default picture when power-on. A blue screen shall display when Blue SCR is selected. A captured picture, if any, shall display when Captured is selected.

Mp3 Lyric

This function is used to turn the Mp3 Lyric function On or Off.

Audio/Video Output and Input

Using the 3.5mm Audio/Video Input

Requires a 3.5mm to 3 x RCA audio/video adapter and an RCA audio/video cable (included).

- Connect the 3.5mm to 3 x RCA audio/ video adapter to the 3.5mm AUDIO/ VIDEO INPUT on the portable DVD player.
- Connect the the RCA stereo audio outputs and composite video outputs on an audio/video source such as a television.
- Press DVD/USB/SD button to display the on-screen menu, press ▲/▼ to highlight AV, then press ENTER to confirm.
- Audio and video played through the connected television will now be output to the portable DVD player.
