

BASIC CROCHET STITCH DIAGRAM

1. Stitch (Abbreviated 'st')

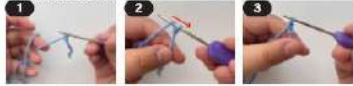
Slip knot

Every piece of crochet chain starts with a slip knot. Loop the yarn around two fingers (leaving a tail) and pull the tail halfway through the loop. Insert the crochet hook into the second loop and gently pull the loop taut onto the crochet hook.



2. Chain Stitch (Abbreviated 'ch')

The chain stitch is the basis for all crochet which is also called a foundation chain.



3. Slip Stitch (Abbreviated 'sl st')

The slip stitch is the flattest or smallest of all crochet stitches. You can use this stitch by slip-stitching the ends of a foundation chain to form a ring.



4. Single Crochet (Abbreviated 'sc')

The single crochet is the most fundamental of all stitches. Gather the yarn with your crochet hook and draw up the loop through the stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull it through two loops, leaving one loop on the hook.



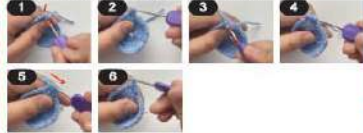
5. Increase (Abbreviated 'inc')

You can increase stitches by adding a stitch at the beginning of the row. Make 2 sc in the same knot.



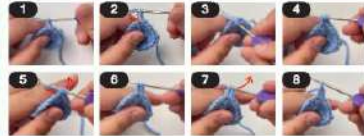
6. Decrease (Abbreviated 'dec')

You can decrease stitches, which is really just subtracting a stitch, in a row. Make a half sc, at which point there are 2 loops in the hook, then crochet a half sc in the next knot, at which point there are 3 loops in the hook, and finally wind the yarn through all 3 loops to finish a dec.



7. Double Crochet (Abbreviated 'dc')

The double crochet is one of the most common crochet stitches and is about twice as tall as a single crochet. Wrap the yarn around the crochet hook. Then insert the crochet hook into the next stitch loop. Wrap the yarn around the hook (three loops now on the hook). Wrap the yarn around the hook again and pull it through the first two loops, leaving two loops on the hook. Then, wrap the yarn around the hook again and bring it through the remaining two loops to leave only one loop on the hook. Complete the row.



8. Half double crochet (Abbreviated 'hdc')

Wrap the yarn around the hook then insert the hook into the next stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and pull through all loops.



9. Round (Abbreviated 'Rd')

This continues the chain stitches into a circle. Each round starts with ch and ends with sl st.

10. Fasten off (Abbreviated 'F/O')

Fasten off by pulling the yarn through the end stitch and pulling it taut. Cut off.



11. Insert your hook into 2nd back hoop



12. Sewing

Generally used for the connection of 2 parts. The plastic needle strap yarns are threaded in turn through the knots where the two parts need to be connected.



If details need to be stitched onto the finished product (such as mouth, eyes, etc.), you can use a plastic needle strap yarns up and down the finished product along the hooked grain.



13. Magic ring

When crocheting round shapes, make 1 magic ring first and then crochet from the center. Crochet through the circle loop in the hand to pull back the taut yarn, make 1 sc to form the first knot. After some sc, pull the bottom yarn tight until all knots form a ring. Make 1 ch in the first knot to close the magic ring.



14. Weaving in/invisible close

Cut the yarn, leaving a long yarn end. Draw the end through the final loop on the hook and thread it onto a yarn needle. Weave your needle through the front loops only on the last round and pull tight. Weave remaining yarn into your piece.



Please note that all yarns needs to be hidden behind the stitch.

 sl slip stitch
 sc single crochet
 inc increase crochet

1. Body

- R1: (Please use the yellow yarn) 6 sc [6 sts]
- R2: 6 inc [12 sts]
- R3: (sc, inc) x 6 times [18 sts]
- R4: (2 sc, inc) x 6 times [24 sts]
- R5: (3 sc, inc) x 6 times [30 sts]
- R6: 30 sc [30 sts]
- R7: (4 sc, inc) x 6 times [36 sts]
- R8: 36 sc [36 sts]
- R9: (5 sc, inc) x 6 times [42 sts]
- R10: 42 sc [42 sts]
- R11: (6sc, inc) x 6 times [48 sts]
- R12-15: 48 sc [48 sts]
- R16: (4 sc, dec) x 8 times [40 sts]
- R17: 40 sc [40 sts]
- R18: (3 sc, dec) x 8 times [32 sts]
- R19: 32 sc [32 sts]
- R20: (2sc, dec) x 8 times [24 sts]
- R21: (sc, dec) x 8 times [16 sts]
- Fill with the fiberfill.
- R22: 8 dec [8 sts]



2. Wing x 2

6 ch, sc, hdc, 3 dc
 Please follow the step to make 2 wings.



3. Comb

(Please use the orange yarns) 4 ch, 2nd ch form hook, hdc, sc, sl, 6 ch, 3rd ch form hook, hdc, 2 dc, sc, sl



4. Chicken Beak

(Please use the orange yarns) 6 sc

- 1. Crochet yarns x 3
- 2. Crochet hook x 1
- 3. Plastic needle x 1
- 4. Ring stitch marker x 1
- 5. 15g fiberfill x 1
